Students should work on facts to 10 and subtraction from 10. We would recommend working on the following topics during the summer.

List of skills to work on during the summer:

Numbers: 0-31

Addition: plus sign, equal sign, total (sum)

Subtraction: minus sign, equal

sign, total (difference)

Measurement: more/less, taller/-shorter, longer/shorter, heavier/lighter, balance

Geometry: 2 dimensional shapes, square, rectangle, circle, straight, side, round

Geometry: 3 dimensional shapes, cone, cube, cylinder, sphere, roll, slide, stack


