homeroom are always welcomed!



CATHOLIC FAITH - Message from Father Andy

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This weekend's first reading, Isaiah 55, says to "seek the Lord while he may be found," and the message is for us to take the opportunities we have to grow in faith. Sometimes, indeed, if we don't take that time to pray first thing in the morning, we'll lose our chance to do that during the rest of the day. And if we spend five years neglecting to practice our faith, we may wake up one day unable to make a connection during prayer or the Mass that we once were able to do. The Gospel today, from Matthew 20, though, has an opposite message from Isaiah 55 because this reading really is saying that it is NEVER TOO LATE to turn to the Lord and to follow God. The way Jesus teaches us this is to tell a story about an employer who hired some people at dawn and some midday and some late in the day and then paid them all the same amount of money. And that some who had worked since dawn protested and said this was unfair and that, in response, the employer had said that it was his money if he wanted to be generous. And the story is about how GOD offers salvation to people whether they have served him all their lives or if people turn to God late in life, that God offers salvation to all just the same.

FALL PROGRAM ON THE EUCHARIST: This year we are going to think about the gift of the Eucharist. We will be meeting in small groups over the course of five weeks in the fall starting the week of Sunday, October 8th and going through the week that will start on Sunday, November 5th.

- Week beginning Oct. 8th: Why Do Catholics Celebrate the Mass?
- Week beginning Oct. 15th: The Early Christians believed in the Real Presence
- Week beginning Oct. 22nd: Why are Catholics asked to go to Mass on Sundays and Holy Days?
- Week beginning Oct. 29th: A Walk Through the Mass
- Week beginning Nov. 5th: The Passover and the Exodus and the Mass

As part of this process, we will have a parish retreat on Saturday, November 11, from 9am – 2pm with lunch provided. It will be free.

It will start with a Mass and then there will be a talk (one in English, one in Spanish) with discussion and then lunch and then one more talk (English track and Spanish track) with discussion.

Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1 - <u>Is 55:6-9</u>

Seek the LORD while he may be found, call him while he is near. Let the scoundrel forsake his way, and the wicked his thoughts; let him turn to the LORD for mercy; to our God, who is generous in forgiving. For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the LORD. As high as the heavens are above the earth, so high are my ways above your ways and my thoughts above your thoughts.

Gospel - Mt 20:1-16a

Jesus told his disciples this parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out at dawn to hire laborers for his vineyard. After agreeing with them for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard. Going out about nine o'clock, the landowner saw others standing idle in the marketplace, and he said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard, and I will give you what is just.' So they went off. And he went out again around noon, and around three o'clock, and did likewise. Going out about five o'clock, the landowner found others standing around, and said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' They answered, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard.' When it was evening the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Summon the laborers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and ending with the first.' When those who had started about five o'clock came, each received the usual daily wage. So when the first came, they thought that they would receive more, but each of them also got the usual wage. And on receiving it they grumbled against the landowner, saying, 'These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us, who bore the day's burden and the heat.' He said to one of them in reply, 'My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?' Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last."


