Our 8th grade scientists had a glowing good time in the lab!

In Science class, students explored variables that affect the rate of reaction, focusing on how temperature can speed up or slow down a chemical reaction. Using glow sticks, they observed how warmer temperatures increased the reaction rate (brighter glow!) while cooler temperatures slowed it down. Hands-on learning like this sparks curiosity, critical thinking, and a deeper appreciation for the wonders of science.
